

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has recently released the syllabus for the Officer Grade B exam, which is scheduled to be conducted online and will cover topics at a graduate level. The exam will consist of 200 questions, which will be a mix of objective (MCQ) and descriptive-type questions. The language of the exam will be English only, and it will be for a total of 300 marks, with candidates having 330 minutes to complete it. Each correct answer will be awarded either 01 or 02 marks, based on the question type.


(b) Ethics at the Workplace & Corporate Governance
